THE REALIZATION I WAS SOON GOING TO DIE and would not be able to live a normal life was something that I never dreamed would happen to me. I was so strong and fit that at first I didn't believe this was happening. But idiopathic pulmonary fibrosis is unrelenting and like a thief in the night it slowly starts robbing your body's ability to make oxygen for yourself and to live a normal life. This disease took me down the longest darkest road I have ever been on. To not be able to do the normal things I had done all my life, like walk, climb the stairs, or just pick up my grandchildren and hug them was the lowest point in my life.
