Proposal to Require UNet^s Registration of all Living Donor Organ Candidates Prior to Transplant

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The Problem

 Some transplant programs register living donor transplant recipients through Waitlistsm before the transplant procedure; others through Tiedism after the transplant





Goal of the Proposal

Improve the safety of living donation by:

- Improving the blood type verification process
- Providing unique identifiers for comparing donor and candidate information
- Providing the accrual of wait time for some candidates





How the Proposal will Achieve its Goal

The proposal would improve living donation safety by:

- Requiring double verification of the intended recipient's blood type in UNetsm before surgery
- Providing a Waitlistsm ID as a unique recipient identifier to verify information at transplant
- Providing a Waitlistsm ID as a unique recipient identifier to help ensure anonymity of both the living donor and organ recipient when needed





Other Potential Benefits

- Standardizing transplant center practice
- Possible deceased donor organ (e.g. zero antigen mismatch) offers
- Possible non-directed donor offers
- Accruing waiting time





Supporting Evidence

Data from 2012:

- Of 5,617 living kidney donor recipients only 527 (9.4%) of the recipients were not on the waiting list prior to transplant
- 88 programs performed at least one living donor kidney transplant for a recipient who was not on the waiting list
- All living liver donor recipients were added to the waiting list before transplant

What Members will Need to Do

 Transplant hospitals will be required to register all transplant candidates before transplantation





Policy Proposal

- Policy 3.4.C Candidate Registration
- <u>Recipients of deceased and living donor organs must be</u> registered as candidates on the waiting list prior to their transplant.
- <u>Transplant programs</u> must complete all candidate additions registrations, modifications, and removals in the waiting list.
